

F. H. S. S., Jan 19, 1895.

Meeting called to order at 7:50 by President Sherwood. Minutes of previous meeting were read but were not accepted. At roll call the following members were found to be absent, Barnwell of Delaware, Van Meter of Oregon, Rock of Wisconsin, Mc Cormick of Utah, Hoagkin of Idaho, Ingram of Maine, Best of Louisiana, and Stanley Hance.

The name of Chas. Warner was proposed for membership. ^{Sen.} Russell, Patterson and Herrington were appointed to investigate the ~~name~~ character of the gentleman proposed.

Sen. Craycroft of W. Dakota was given permission to introduce a bill to be known as the San Joaquin River Bill.

Senator Latimer of Arkansas was given permission to introduce a bill, creating a board for the inspection of canned goods.

Senator Buckley of Indiana was given permission to introduce a bill "providing for the appointment of a National Health Bureau."

Senator Cardwell of Connecticut was given permission to introduce a bill, "appropriating a sum of money for the strengthening of our navy."

Sen. Craycroft, Edwards and Foster were appointed as a committee ^{on Commerce and Sanitation} to draw up Sen. Craycroft's bill. ^{to be referred to the}

Senators Latimer, Buckley and Martin were appointed a committee to draw up Sen. Latimer's bill. ^{Sen.} Cardwell and Latimer were appointed to report for the Republican and Expositor respectively.

Moved and ^{seconded} a warrant be drawn in favor of the chairman of the lamp committee for the sum of \$1. Carried.

Moved and seconded the debate for the evening be postponed indefinitely. Carried.

It was moved and seconded we refer to the head of "Reports of Select Committees, Carried.

The committee reported favorably on Craycroft's bill, and it was read for the first time by the Secretary.

Moved and seconded we have a mock trial Carried.

It was moved and seconded we reconsider the previous motion Carried.

The original motion was then put to the house and lost.

Sen. Mot's amendment, amending Article II, section ^{of the By-laws} V to read, "Any member absent a meeting without sufficient excuse shall be fined 10 cents. The name of any member absent (4) four successive meetings, without being excused, therefrom or paying this fine, shall be dropped from membership, unless a motion to retain said name, be carried by a ($\frac{2}{3}$) two-thirds vote of the active members present was carried.

after the program committee had announced that the debate for ^{the} next meeting, would be Sen. Craycroft's "San Joaquin River Bill" and the speakers, Craycroft of North Dakota and Edwards of Maryland for the affirmative, and Rutherford of Texas and Buckley of Indiana speakers for the negative, it was moved and seconded we adjourn, Carried, Senate then adjourned,
